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HALL OF HEROES



Education visits: Weeks 9 to Week 10 of Term 3 (fully booked), and Weeks 1 to 8 of Term 4.

It's a bird! It's a plane! No! It's a Hall of Heroes!

Superheroes have taken over Upper Hutt at the new international exhibition Hall of Heroes at Whirinaki Whare Taonga. This interactive hands-on adventure invites you to explore the world's superheroes including Batman, Superman, Iron Man, Black Panther, Wonder Woman and more, and discover your own superpowers. Journey through the world of crime-fighters and gadgets, movie props, replicas and rare artifacts from past and present major motion pictures and television shows, including a replica of the George Barris 1966 Batmobile. Come face to face with life sized statues from the superhero universes, including Dr. Who's TARDIS and Batman on his rooftop and test your own superhero skills through a series of interactive stations. Education Visit: Gallery Tour and Art Workshop. 1 Hour and 45 minutes Suitable for Year 1 and up · FREE



What's your superpower and what does it mean to be powerful? These are the questions that being an everyday superhero invoke. Ākonga will look at the concept of power throughout time and consider the idea of superheroes as role models. They will have the chance to look at how comic books do (or do not) reflect what is happening in society at any given time. This tour and workshop will have curriculum links to Visual Arts and Social Studies.

You will begin by visiting Superhero Headquarters before gathering information from the exhibition, immersing yourself in an interactive superhero experience. You will then bring your findings back to headquarters for us to share and apply to our own lives and experiences. We will them complete a piece of artwork inspired by comic books and pop art. This workshop will be great for making links to student wellbeing, leadership, citizenship and relationships.

In our creative workshop we will:

- Explore the traits superheroes have and why we value these in society.
- Identify and express our own superpowers and those of others in our lives.
- Look at the concept of power and responsibility.
- Explore comic book imagery and create our own pop art to take home.




PLANNING A VISIT
