

RARELY SEEN: PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE EXTRAORDINARY

6 February- 2 May

In this exhibition of visual wonders, National Geographic reveals a world very few have had the chance to see for themselves.

Shot by some of the world's finest photographers, "Rarely Seen" features striking images of places, events, natural phenomena, and man-made heirlooms seldom seen by human eyes. It's all here: a green-crowned brilliant hummingbird looking eye to eye with a pit viper, the Rayong Dam, an underwater park in Austria, ice caves, a supercell storm cloud, and a royal white tiger. With an introduction by veteran National Geographic photographer Stephen Alvarez, whose work has taken him from the Peruvian Andes to the deepest caves of Papua New Guinea, this exhibition captures once-in-a-lifetime moments, natural wonders, and rarely seen objects from across the globe.

Exhibition tour: students will be led in a discussion around the themes of "Rarely seen" of conservation, geography and global communities. They will have an opportunity to look closely at the photos and interpret them in their own time.

Art workshop: students will learn how to apply acrylic paint using pallette knives, inspired by the photography of rarely seen. They will experiment with texture, and form, creating a piece of art for them to take back to school.

Exhibition tour: 45 minutes

Exhibition tour and art workshop: 1 hr 30 mins, free.

PERIPHERY- SEUNG YUL OH

20 February- 11 April

Seung yul ohs's interactive sculpture Periphery, brings his playfulness to the gallery. This large scale, inflatable installation, on loan from Dunedin public art Gallery is an environment to be walked through and experienced by students. Light hearted and serious, the work tests the boundaries between audience and artworks, blurring the boundary between spectating and participating, and creating an active engagement in the artwork.

Art workshop: bubble art, students will make their own bubble art print to take home.

Exhibition tour and art workshop: 1 hour, free.
