

CLOUD PINK 1 FEBRUARY – 5 APRIL IMAGINE IF YOU COULD TOUCH THE SKY

Cloud Pink is an interactive installation by Seoul-based creative Everyware [Hyunwoo Bang and Yunsil Heo] that allows the public to live out childhood dreams of touching and manipulating clouds. This immersive piece invites visitors to poke and prod the sky from below, thereby causing a visual reaction in the projected simulation of wafting pink clouds.

REREHIKO 1 FEBRUARY - 29 MARCH

An immersive video installation by Kāi Tahu artist Rachael Rakena. Rachael Rakena's sensual video installation considers how the arrival of the internet effected change for Māori. Rerehiko suspends performers in a watery underworld, where haka, waiata and taiaha merge with streams of email, encouraging us to contemplate the world anew.

PERIPHERY 4 APRIL - 21 JUNE

Seung Yul Oh's interactive sculpture Periphery, brings his playfulness to the gallery. This large inflatable installation, on loan from the Dunedin Public Art Gallery, is an environment to be walked through and to be experienced... from the inside out. Light hearted and serious, Seung Yul Oh tests relationships between audiences and artworks, artworks and spaces, blurring the boundary between spectacle and participation, between passive and active engagement.




BE PERSUADED

10 APRIL - 28 JUNE

To mark the 200th anniversary of her passing, Dressing Australia Museum of Costume has designed a rare and wonderful exhibition bringing Jane Austen to life in original fashion of the era. Be Persuaded follows Austen's life—and the unforgettable characters she created from growing up in the 18th Century into the era most associated with her - the Regency era at the beginning of the 19th Century. Be Persuaded features rare fashion, accessories and ephemera from the 18th Century when Austen was born, through to the 1840s.

NGA HAU NGAKAU 27 JUNE – 30 AUGUST

Luminous paintings, intricately carved taonga pūoro and beautiful music are woven together to form the extraordinary exhibition Ngā Hau Ngākau (Breath of Mine). A collaborative installation between Robin Slow, Brian Flintoff and Bob Bickerton, this exhibition uses painting, sculpture and sound to explore the ideas of harmony, memory and storytelling focussing on the role of manu (birds) as messengers in Maori Mythology, that connect the physical and the spiritual realms. They fill the gallery not only through Robin Slow's gleaming paintings but in Bob Bickerton's sound scape and Brian Flintoff's carvings and taonga pūoro (musical instruments).

MOLLER-FRATICELLI GUITAR DUO
